### **\$1,000 Glow-up, Grow Up Scholarship Slam, D: June 27, 2019**

You must tag this poem correctly and be registered as a member of the community to have a chance, so read the scholarship slam description and all the rules.

2. Add an original poem to Power Poetry by **Thursday, June 27, 2019**. You'll need to register as a member of our community first.

From the SCHOLARSHIP FAQ:

*How do I submit my poem--and how do I know that my poem is entered in the contest?*

Register as a user on our site. Then go back to the scholarship slam and click 'add a poem.' Write your poem and submit. To confirm that your poem is entered, go to My Account (in the top right corner of the website), scroll down to My Stuff, and see if your poem is tagged with appropriate scholarship slam. You can see this by clicking "edit" on your poem and making sure it is tagged to the correct slam.”

Selected criteria from webpage:

Resume submissions can come in word, PDF, or info-graphic format, attached to an email and sent to [scholarship@resumecompanion.com](mailto:scholarship@resumecompanion.com). The body of the email should include:

Your name

University attending (if applicable)

Short explanation of who’s resume you are submitting

All applications will receive a confirmation email upon receipt on our end.

1. Staff at Resume Companion remember the hardship of being a student so want to make this scholarship available to as many students as possible! As such, we do not require any sort of minimum GPA, and both domestic and international students may apply.
2. All applicants must be enrolled, or due to be enrolled, in full time university education for the semester they are applying to receive the scholarship fund. For example, a senior high student can apply during the Spring 2017 semester, despite still being at high school, as long as they will be enrolled in university for the Fall semester 2017 when they are due to receive the scholarship fund.
3. One application can be made per student, per year.”
